REAL TALK / WEEK 4

DAY 1

And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Colossigns 3:17 NIV

We constantly have to make choices in life. Whether we're deciding what to wear for school, what kind of relationships we want to have, or even if we want a relationship at all, the choices can seem endless! But even though choices can feel overwhelming at times, the reality is they're also a gift. God gives us the ability to decide how we live our lives. And this verse reminds us of the best thing we can do with anything we choose: Do it all for Jesus. That means we should always try to remember and honor Him with our choices, no matter what!

Take some time today to pray that God will remind you to honor Jesus with the decisions you make for your life.

DAY 2

Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect.

Romans 12:2 NLT

In all areas of our lives, it can be easy to compare what we have or don't have with what the world tells us is important. When we measure our lives against what we see our friends doing or the things we see on social media, we can feel like we're coming up short. If we don't have what they have or do what they do, we must be missing out, right? Wrong! Here, Paul, the writer of this verse, gives us a new way to think about our lives. Instead of trying to live like others, we can instead live for God.

We can trust that God's plan for our lives is better than anything we'd compare it to. Think about this for a minute today and find peace in that truth!

DAY 3

Be on guard. Stand firm in the faith. Be courageous. Be strong. And do everything with love. 1 Corinthians 16:13-14 NLT

There are many types of love we can have in life. Love from our parents or guardians, love from our friends, love from our family, and even love from our pets—it's all something we experience in different ways. But the most extraordinary type of love we'll ever experience is the love we receive from God. God's love gives us the strength we need to face anything life throws at us. So, when this verse tells us to "do everything in love," it's reminding us to let everything we say or do reflect the great love that we've received from God.

This week, talk to a friend, small group leader, or trusted adult about ways you'd like to know more about or show others more of God's love.

DAY 4

Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think. Ephesians 3:20 NLT

Have you ever wondered what the real point of life is? Is it to be successful? Is it to be rich? Is it to fall in love, get married, and have children? While all of those things are awesome, they're not the only things God has in mind for us. They're not even the whole point of life! This verse reminds us that God has so many good things planned for us to experience. Things even more amazing than what the world tells us is good. When we trust and believe that what God has planned for us is best, we'll find peace in discovering God's plan for our lives as we go.

This week, spend some time in prayer, asking God to show you that the ultimate goal in life is to follow God's plans.

DAY 5

"You are the light of the world like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden." Matthew 5:14 NLT



Today, remember that you don't need anyone else to reflect God's image to the world. You can shine your light to the world right now, right where you are. Think about one way you can do that and then do it!




DAY 6
