WHO IS JESUS? / WEEK 1

MIDDLE SCHOOL

DAY 1

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:38-39 NIV

What's the farthest distance you've ever traveled? Whether it was just a few miles down the road or hundreds of miles away, the distance probably felt big. In the same way, sometimes we feel like the distance between God and us is just as big. The space between where we want to be and where we actually are when it comes to our faith can seem enormous. But the truth is, there is no distance between us and God. Because, as this verse reminds us, nothing can separate us from God's love.

Get out for a walk today, keeping track of the distance you go as you do. With each step, remind yourself that no matter how far away you may feel, nothing can separate you from God's love.

DAY 2

For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

Ephesians 2:18 NIV

When Jesus came to the Earth, He was on a mission. That mission was to save us from our sins and make a way for us to be connected to God forever. And what do we celebrate at Easter every year? It's the celebration of Jesus accomplishing that mission through His death and resurrection. Now, there's nothing that can separate us from God. But when we believe in Jesus and choose to follow Him with our lives, we find a connection to God through His Spirit. That's something worth celebrating, both at Easter and every day!

Identify a trusted adult in your life—someone you know loves and follows Jesus! Share this verse with them, asking them to talk about what it means for their lives. Then, share what it means to you, too!

DAY 3

But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

Ephesians 2:13 NIV

At first glance, this verse may seem difficult to understand. After all, there's a lot of history packed in just one sentence! When Adam and Eve sinned (Genesis 3), it meant that humans now had to be separated from God. But because God loves us so much, God didn't want us to remain separated. So, God sent Jesus to Earth to make a way for us to be near to God again. Jesus' death and resurrection—the very thing we remember at Easter—built a bridge that allows us all to have a personal relationship with God.

Take time today to journal a few thoughts about this truth. What does it mean for your life to know that because of Jesus, you can be connected to God?



DAY 4

Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

Hebrews 4:16 NIV

Have you ever seen someone famous in real life? Maybe a celebrity, or an athlete, or a YouTuber. If you have, then you know that most famous people don't leave home without security. They've got a bodyguard or a team to surround them! Why? To make getting close to them difficult. Here, the author of Hebrews tells us that we don't have to worry about any of that when we approach God. Because of Jesus, there is nothing and no one that can keep us from getting to God. So, we can approach God boldly and with confidence.

Think of something you need to talk to God about in your life right now. Then, go to God in prayer confidently, knowing nothing will hold you back.

DAY 5

"Don't be afraid, for I am with you. Don't be discouraged, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand."

Isaiah 41:10 NLT

The next time you feel alone or discouraged, remember that you can always connect with God no matter what's going on. To help you remember this, try to memorize this verse this week.


DAY 6

You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.

Jeremiah 29:13 NIV

Jesus' death and resurrection made certain that we'll always have a way to find and connect with God.

John 16:33 NLT
