
DAY 6

It can be hard to remember that the God who performed all the miracles we read about in the Bible is the same God we can know personally today. DAY 1

I have told you all this so that you may have peace in me. Here on earth, you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart, because I have overcome the world. John 16:33 NLT

What image comes to mind when you think about courage? The idea behind the word courage comes from the word "heart." That means when we gather the courage do something scary, that bravery comes from our hearts. When we are resilient and push forward through difficult situations, it comes from the courage Jesus has given us in our hearts. When Jesus reminds us here to "take heart." He's basically saying, "Be brave, be encouraged. I'm the One who will win when it comes down to it." Knowing Jesus is with us and will take care of everything we're facing can give us the motivation we need to keep going!

Make a list of all the areas where you could use a little courage. Then, ask Jesus to provide you with it!

I look up to the mountains—does my help come from there? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth! Psalm 121:1-2 NLT

Even if you've never seen a mountain in person, you know based on pictures how massive and breathtaking they are. They rise above the earth, solid and sturdy. No matter what weather or natural disasters they face, those mountains remain standing. They are great examples of resilience! And more than that, they're a reminder of the God who made them (and us!) to be resilient. God made the mountains, the sky they reach up to, and the ground they stand on. God created those mountains to stand strong through whatever comes their way, and God can do the same for you.


Today, take a walk outside. Look for a symbol in God's creation that can help you remember that God made you to be resilient.

DAY 3

Trust in the Lord always, for the Lord God is the eternal Rock. Isaiah 26:4 NLT

The next time you go outside, find a small rock and hold it in your hand. The thing about rocks is that they have a pretty long lifespan! And while that's a fun fact, it's even better when we think about what the Bible says about God in a similar way. See, the Bible promises us that God is like a rock. God lasts forever—like actually forever! That means God is indestructible, sturdy, trustworthy, and dependable for all of time. God is the one thing we can count on to stay the same no matter what happens in life.

Ask your small group leader how they trust and count on God. Then ask them to pray that you would be able to depend on God in the same real, lasting way.



DAY 4

For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him. Philippians 2:13 NLT

On any given day, our motivation to do all the things we are responsible for can either increase or decrease. Sometimes it increases because of a good mood, getting a good grade, or a great time hanging out with friends. But other times, that motivation decreases when our circumstances feel tough. Whatever the reason, it can be difficult to find the motivation in times like that. The good news is, we can always get a little help from God. When you choose to follow Jesus, God starts working in your life to give you the motivation to keep going and growing in faith no matter what.

Ask God to help you identify the areas in your life that you need a little help to stay motivated. Then, pray for God's help to be resilient enough to keep going.

DAY 5

God works in different ways, but it is the same God who does the work in all of us. 1 Corinthians 12:6 NLT
